A Look at 2018 Activities

- The **Sailor Talks** this winter and spring have been great, with presentations on cruising, first aid, marine paints, navigation rules, and racing tips. If you missed them, you missed out (but there will be more next year)! Thanks to all who organized these and gave presentations.
- The **AMSEA Sailboat Safety Course** on 21-22 April was a valuable training for participants. Some pictures from some of the training drills are on the website.
- Our annual **Spring SEAS Party** is scheduled for 11 May at Sandy Beach, starting at 6:00pm. It will be a fun evening and we hope you can make it!
- The following day (12 May) will be the start of the new sailing season as we take part in the **Juneau Maritime Festival**. Details for Club participation are in the works, but will include buoy races between SEAS boats on a course within the Turning Basin in Gastineau Channel followed by public tours of SEAS boats at the Goldbelt dock. Let us know if you'd like to participate as a race boat/crew or volunteering on the dock.
- The **2018 SEAS Cup** races a series of 15 races held over the summer, for skill building, and yes, a little competition! Whether you are keen on competitive racing or are just up to the challenge of getting out for the day with other sailors, the SEAS Cup offers a great way to be challenged, test your skills, and meet new people. The SEAS Cup draft race schedule is being developed and will be posted to the website here: http://seasailing.us/SeasCup.
- The **Admiralty Island Rally** –The rally consists of day races, circumnavigating Admiralty Island over 7 days, beginning and ending in Gastineau Channel, June 16-23. Further details will be posted on the web page www.seasailing.us/air as they become available.
- **Get Out The Boat** (**GOTB**) Typically on any given Wednesday evening through the summer, weather and skippers permitting, SEAS sailors try to get out on the waters of Gastineau Channel and Auke Bay, and offer a casual way of initiating interested people on board and training prospective crew for weekend events. This is an informal way of getting our boats out every week in a non-racing, casual environment. The Club is making a priority this year of offering
